BACKGROUND

Wiehahn Commission recommended strict regulation of gambling, 1995

Gambling Review Commission Report, 2010 recommending policy reforms.

Final Policy is approved by Cabinet 17 February 2016. Consultations on the National Gambling Amendment Bill was conducted in 2016 National Gambling Act, 1996 is passed introducing the National Gambling Board

National Gambling Amendment Act, 2008 passed to regulate interactive gambling. Act is not promulgated 2004 National Gambling Act amends 1996 Act introducing the National Gambling Policy Council to ensure policy alignment at national and provincial government.



WIEHAHN COMMISSION POLICY OBJECTIVES AND ANALYSIS

Section 4
